

Mainstreet Community Services Association Inc. (MCSA, Inc.)
Board of Directors Meeting
March 18, 2014
6:00 PM

Present: President-Rick Harris, Vice President-Sharon Dickey, Treasurer-Phaedra Brooks, Member-At-Large Frankie Bryson, Community Association Manager-Nadine Rivers-Johnson, homeowners/residents, local elected officials, and various communities within a four-mile radius of Mainstreet.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Rick Harris, President. In lieu of a Board of Directors meeting, Mainstreet hosted a Community Concerns and Homeowner Question & Answer Session. President Harris noted the order of Board business and introduced community representatives from Chapman Mills/Redan Park, Hidden Hills, Kingsgate, Muirfield, Martins Crossing, Fox Valley, and Scarsborough Square. In addition, local elected officials Interim CEO Lee May and Super 7 District Commissioner Stan Watson were in attendance along with Chief Probation Officer Carla Hardnett, East Precinct Commander Tonya Dedrick, Public Education Specialist Officer W. Barr, Gordon Burkette, of Keep DeKalb Beautiful and Bettye Davis of ONEDeKalb.

A Crime Watch question and answer session followed covering topics such as crime statistics, response times, and follow-ups. Public Education Specialist Barr passed out important public safety information pamphlets to homeowners and residents on the Court Watch Program, DeKalb County Police Telephone Resource List, and the Neighborhood Watch Program.

Super 7 District Commissioner Watson was introduced by President Harris and spoke briefly with homeowners. Chief Probation Officer Hardnett was introduced and gave an overview of the Juvenile Court 12-Point System, assessments and covered retention rates of children in the Juvenile System, followed by a question & answer segment with homeowners.

Keep DeKalb Beautiful's Gordon Burkette gave comments and reported on the Barbashela Creek and Snapfinger Creek system. Barbashela Creek runs through Mainstreet Community, and it has been impacted by the flood of 2009 causing flooding in the playground, Pavilion areas of the community, and around both lakes.

Interim CEO Lee May was introduced and spoke at length with those present about DeKalb County issues that affect us all. Homeowners were given the rest of the meeting to ask questions and address concerns directly with CEO May.

The meeting wrapped up with President Harris thanking everyone for attending and hoped that the meeting was productive and informative. Another Community Cent\$ Seminar is scheduled for the next quarter.

The next Board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 15, 2014, at 7:30 pm.
