

**MCSA Tennis Court Rules/Policy Changes to 2006 Addendum**

**Effective 1 September 2010**

**By MCSA, Inc Board of Directors**

- 1. Mandate effective 1 September 2010, all members of the Tennis Committee serve a 12 month term, every 3 years commencing 1 Jan thru 31 Dec to allow other interested resident(s)/homeowner(s) that want to serve an opportunity.**
- 2. Make it exclusive authority of the BODs to approve the use of community recreational tennis courts by teams for league play.**
- 3. Limit the number of teams using Mainstreet courts to a maximum of 3 teams (2 day and 1 evening) with only 1 practice day/1 court, and time for sanctioned matches).**
- 4. Tennis Committee must submit team rosters to the BODs for approval 4 weeks prior to rosters being due to league and 7 days prior to the BODs meeting for which approval is requested. Rosters must include: Name of each player, whether they are a Mainstreet resident, and confirmation resident is in good standing. At least 2 residents must be on the team and be the Captain and/or Co-Captain.**
- 5. Teams made up of 51% or more of Mainstreet residents will have priority for use of community recreational courts for sanctioned matches and 1 court for practices.**
- 6. Teams comprised of 90% or more of individuals from other area communities will not be allowed to use Mainstreet community recreational courts.**
- 7. Tennis instructors must submit for Board approval a roster indicating status of players, whether resident is current in their assessments, fees to be charged players, and date reserved court needed.**
- 8. Post a sign on courts informing residents of the "community recreational" policy on the priority of court availability for residents.**
- 9. Scheduling of community recreational courts will be done through the MCSA, Inc. Office Management staff Tuesday – Saturday and, Sunday and Monday will be done by signing up on the roster at the courts on a first-come, first-serve basis for up to 1 ½ hours. This does not include use of courts during sanctioned match times, and no team practices on Sunday.**
- 10. With only 2 courts available within Mainstreet and to alleviate the domination of our "private" community recreational tennis courts by non-residents, the following "county funded" facilities are available and can handle any level, any time, and any league tennis team: Dekalb Tennis Center, Mountain Park Tennis Center, and Sugar Creek Golf and Tennis Center.**
